The PEPFAR/USAID-funded Program to Build Leadership and Accountability in Nigeria's Health System (PLAN-Health), managed by Management Sciences For Health (MSH), is a five year project (2010 – 2015) aimed at strengthening the institutional capacity, leadership, and management skills of public sector institutions and civil society organizations for better HIV/AIDS and other health services delivery to vulnerable groups in Nigeria.

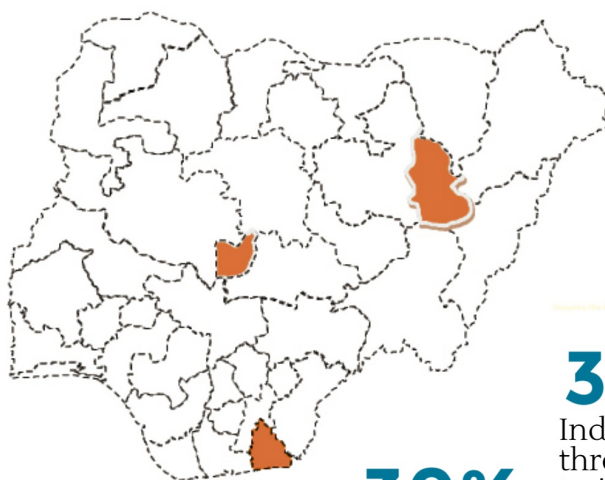

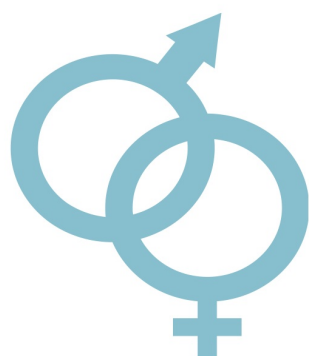
