PUBLIC SECTOR SYSTEMS STRENGTHENING PLUS (PS3+)

The PS3+ activity works with the Government of Tanzania (GOT) to institutionalize public sector systems that are responsive to citizens' needs for essential quality public services at the local level, particularly for underserved populations.

PS3+ strengthens GOT management systems, especially at the local level and promotes increased citizen engagement in the transparent governance of public services.

The activity achieves its objectives through three key strategies:

- Strengthen key GOT management systems, notably the Planning and Reporting system, the Facility Financial Accounting and Reporting System and their interoperability with other central planning/budgeting and financial management systems. These systems promote evidence-driven decision-making using data and information.
- Enhance rural and urban community systems to improve the planning and management of public services, especially agriculture, education, nutrition, water, and sanitation. Improved public services benefit underserved demographics such as women and youth and facilitate private sector engagement as a partner in the provision of public goods and services.
